AN ANNUAL AND MONTHLY OVERVIEW



THE LOST DECADE - 2005-2015

When you compare the job rates for London's Census Metropolitan Area (CMA) over the last decade, you see some revealing trends. In 2008, London felt the affects of the economic recession, and thus, employment rates decreased. The years after a recession show a period of recovery rather than growth.


Employment Rate for Londoners Relatively Flat for Decade - Employment Rates, End of Year 2005-2015




In December 2005, 63.6% of London's population aged 15 + was employed. At the end of 2015, 60.3% of London's population aged 15 + was employed. We still not have recovered to achieve pre-recession employment rates.

Employment Rate - Monthly 2016 (%)



How Much of London is Working Right Now? (Unadjusted)


This graphic gives a representation of the proportion of the population aged 15+ in London (CMA) according to employment status.
